



- ◆ The hinge moment in our liturgy is the Offertory. The Offertory is the time in which we remember that God has given us all that we have and in return we offer a portion of that back to God... "All things come of thee, O Lord. And of thine own have we given thee."
- ◆ The mission of the Church is to partner with God and one another to do God's work in the world. We partner not only through our time and talents, but also our treasure. The various ministries of Ascension require financial support through program, staffing, supplies, as well as a building and all that it takes to maintain and run it. We can't operate the day school without plumbing or livestream services without Wi-Fi. Pledging, and subsequently giving, to the church is part of your role in this partnership.
- ♦ To make a first fruits, proportional, sacrificial pledge to the church and then to prioritize that as you pay bills each month keeps God in the midst of the mundane. God is not simply a divine character who we dress up for Easter and Christmas, but the God of the ordinary, everyday aspects of our lives. God is in the midst of our sufferings, our joys, and our daily grind. To practice faithful giving in the midst of everyday living is to center and re-center our lives on Christ in ways that lead to transformation.
- Our giving makes a difference to the kingdom. Lives are changed through outreach and in-reach ministries. We share love and grace with one another be it members of our church or our commu-

nity. We feed people in Honduras, we shelter the homeless, we tutor kids from down the block, we take flowers to shut-ins, we put signs in the front yards of newborns, we baptize, we bury, we serve lobsters. By doing all these things, and so many more, we build up the kingdom and remind ourselves and others there is more to this world than what we see on tv or social media; there is more hope than fear; there is more purpose than power.

Shakespeare told us that the question was "to be or not to be" but I think the deeper question might be "to give or not to give." Giving is directly connected to our spiritual growth and development. To walk the path God lays out before us includes faithful giving.

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From the Archives...

Friends,

The videos of preparations for Ascension Day gave us a good look at the interior of the Blair Tower and the bells which we hear every week. I remembered an article about the bells which was published in the February 2015 edition of The Tower. I thought you might enjoy reading it again.

"There were no bells in the belfry (Blair Tower) at Church of the Ascension until 1965. At that time, three large bronze bells, which were cast by the John Taylor Company of Laughborough, England, were given to the Ascension as memorials. The tuned G bell weighs 1,400 pounds and was given in memory of Edith Hunter Dobbs. The A bell weighs 1,000 pounds and was given in the memory of the

Weisenburgh family members. The "tenor," or B bell, weighs 730 pounds and was given in memory of Edith Gayle Miller. The bells were rung by electronic clappers which were controlled from a mechanical device located near the organ console.



After the fire in 1984, the bells were removed and sent to a foundry to be repaired and cleaned. At this time, the decision was made to re-install the bells so that they could be rung by rope pulls located near the pulpit. A metal frame was installed in the tower to support this small "ring of bells" and a "headstock," or holder, was built for each bell. A large wheel with a track was attached to the "headstock," and the rope was attached to the wheel. As the bell moves back and forth, the rope wraps and unwraps in the track around the wheel. This is very much like the equipment used in "ringing changes" which are very popular in Europe and especially in Great Britain. Ringing changes involve at least six or seven bells which are numbered and run in numerical patterns by several people standing in a circle in the "ringing

room" where the bell pulls are located. The intricacy of the numerical patterns would depend on the number of bells available.

In a column written by Burns Bennett for the Montgomery Advertiser-Journal for the dedication of the bells in October of 1965, Mr. Bennett wrote the following, "Many of us are born, christened, grow up and marry, die and are buried to the sound of bells. Bells ring out the old and ring in the new."

Sing to the Lord a new song

Singing and Stewardship...

Colossians 3:16-17

¹⁶Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

What does music in worship have to do with stewardship? Yes, this is the time we talk about financial gifts to God's work, but we also emphasize the stewardship of our time and talents. I have written extensively about why God asks us to sing, why he commands it in scripture. But this month I want to look at this passage from Colossians and notice two important phrases.

". . . and with GRATITUDE in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs TO GOD.

At Church of the Ascension, gratitude has been a cornerstone of our theology of stewardship. We hear and know that our gifts are a response to God's goodness and generosity. If I had to read only one passage in scripture that would keep me living in the Kingdom, I thank Colossians 3:1-17 might be it. There is a lot of wisdom and good guidance there. And towards the end we are told to sing with gratitude to God.

When we make ourselves vulnerable by singing, if we sing in thanksgiving, regardless of the song, it's really good for us. There is something about gratitude that is healthy, life-giving, and important.

Then, we're told to sing to God. One of the more amusing things that new singers have said to me over the years is "I only want to sing solos." Hmmm... maybe you could do that somewhere, but that's not why we sing here. [Then, COVID comes along and we can't sing in groups. Oh well, God, I'm confused.] But to God is where we direct our praise, petition, our talents and our deepest selves. I encourage you to sing your thanks to God. Make it up. But sing it, in the shower, in the kitchen, in the car --- wherever! Sing the words of the Psalms. It will change you, and that for the better, healthier, stronger.

Sing to God with gratitude in your heart. Call me if you would like to be part of that ministry here at the Ascension.


