From the Rector...

It's not often that I get to sit in the pew on a Sunday morning. This past Sunday, Steve and I went to church at Holy Spirit Episcopal Church in Gulf Shores. We are here on vacation and have visited the little church on Fort Morgan road about once a year for the last thirty years.

One of my seminary classmates is the rector and as soon as I walked in the door he and I began to give each other a little grief—all in good fun. He tried to ban me from worship and I told him I had brought a score card to grade the service. The others around us quickly



caught on that we knew each other and smiled appreciatively at our teasing of one another. We exchanged hugs and went to find a seat on a back pew of the church.

We were barely in the pew when another old friend who we hadn't seen for some time noticed us and flew across the aisle to give us a hug. The procession had scarcely passed when the priest's spouse saw us and also came to hug our necks. Our hearts were filled and we hadn't even sung the second stanza of "O day of radiant gladness."

As is Holy Spirit's custom, we were introduced at the announcement time. Though I generally don't like being recognized in church, this is the exception. I know the custom here and have experienced it every time we come to worship. (Though I do wonder if we might not lay claim to an honorary membership status as there are plenty of people who only attend church once a year and claim to be members.) We were well received by many and after the service those who had smiled warmly at us, made a point to come talk

to us and express their gratitude for our worshipping with them.

Our experience on Sunday was a good reminder as to why coming to church is so important. You cannot have your hand shaken or your neck hugged through a screen. And though you may hear a good message from the preacher or beautiful music being sung, the rush of endorphins and good feelings is limited unless you are physically present.

As a society, we have seen a significant reduction in attendance at church since the pandemic. Most researchers claim that the number one reason for our lack of attendance is the loss of habit. Prior to the pandemic we were in the habit of going to church. It was an accepted social norm and a part of our spiritual discipleship. After a year or two of not attending church and listening to the reinforcing rhetoric of staying home—we stopped engaging with church and have had trouble reengaging since. This is as true of CoA as it is of other churches—Episcopal, Protestant, even Catholic.

The years prior to pandemic were already bearing witness to the decline of organized religion in America. Now, it seems to have sped up a little. When I think of where influence lies and realize the limited access the church has on the world, I am not that surprised by partisan politics and increased global anxiety. You will not find hope in a world filled with woe and scarcity thinking.

This Sunday begins our annual stewardship campaign, and though the church needs money to operate—pay employees, fund mission and outreach, even keep the lights on—I am less concerned with these things than I am with the spiritual health and vitality of our very souls. Giving is about transformation. When we give our money in service of God's purposes, we begin to transform our relationship with money, with God, with ourselves. When we give our time—by coming to church, worshipping, and volunteering—we transform how we understand the world and the role we play as kingdom dwellers in this earth.

Going to church at Holy Spirit reminded me of how transformative showing up can be. To be welcomed and appreciated simply because you showed up fills your heart in expansive ways and reminds you of the ever-present hope that dwelling in the kingdom brings. It truly was a day of "radiant gladness."






Be in the nave early this Sunday!





Dear members of Ascension,

As you may remember, last fall the Vestry and Rector, in consultation with the bishop, hired a consultant to review our governance amongst other tasks. In response to the

governance recommendations made by this consultant, a Governance Task Group (GTG) was appointed by the Vestry. This group consisted of Ellen Brooks (chair), Young Boozer, Elizabeth Conner, Jenny Garrett, Christopher Turner, Candice Frazer (Rector), April McKay (Vestry), Smitty Smith (Vestry), Dorman Walker (Vestry), and Tim Marquardt (Chair of Roles and Responsibilities Committee). The GTG met fourteen times over the course of seven months (February – August 2024). In August they submitted their final report along with a draft of proposed bylaws for The Episcopal Church of the Ascension.

Your Vestry has since reviewed these bylaws as to their efficacy for our governance and ensured that they meet national and diocesan canonical standards. We now submit them to you, the parish at large, for comment, questions, and suggestions as we prepare for final approval by the Vestry. Please feel encouraged to speak with a member of the GTG, the Vestry, Drew, or me for clarifications or suggestions (noting that all comments and their authorship will be shared with the Vestry and clergy). You may also submit any questions or comments via email at staff@coascension.org. There will be two parish wide meetings for open discussion, education, and feedback on the proposed bylaws: Sunday.October27 immediately following the 10:30am service and on Wednesday.October30 at Gpm. Both meetings will take place in Ascension Hall.

Bylaws are an important part of how the church functions and fosters good relationships among members. The Vestry and clergy are eager to receive your feedback and participation in this significant step forward in the life of The Episcopal Church of the Ascension. We invite you to be a part of this process and hope you will join us in discerning this work of the Holy Spirit by reading the proposed bylaws and attending one of the parish wide meetings if at all possible.



REFUGE


There is a story told after the wildfires of Tennessee several years ago. As firefighters walked through the burned forests and fields, they would kick over anything that seemed to be smouldering to ensure all the fires were put out. One firefighter kicked over what looked to be a smouldering mess of debris and a dozen chicks came running out. That is when he realized the mess he had kicked over was a pile of feathers that had once been a hen who had bravely sacrificed her life for the lives of her precious flock. Those chicks had taken REFUGE beneath their mother and she had willingly provided it. Her sacrifice ensured them life.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus compares himself to a mother hen who gathers her flocks under the shelter of her wings. In Psalm 17:8, the psalmist prays that God will hide us under the shadow of his wings. There is something about God that offers us a security and peace when we seek shelter or safety therein.
