
- 9. Bathrooms—Where else would I find the time to peruse all my social media accounts? Nothing says "good morning" like a dog video on TikTok!



The Weekly WORD

RIGHTEOUSNESS

In the classic, A Christmas Carol, Scrooge is confronted by his deceased partner, Jacob Marley. Marley clanks on to the scene, covered in chains, and warns Scrooge that he will be visited by three ghosts. If he doesn't change his ways, he, too, will be bound in chains through all eternity.

The three ghosts who visit Scrooge enact a sort of judgment upon Scrooge. That judgment is not one of hell and condemnation from God, it is one of Scrooge's own doing. The ghosts simply force Scrooge to take a closer look at his life. As Screoge observes his past, present, and future he convicts himself for his behavior and choices.


The three ghosts serve to scourge Scrooge from his evil and guilt. There intervention in his life serves as a sort of refiner's fire that draws him toward RIGHTEOUSNESS—an act of being freed from sin and guilt. Over the course of the night, the ghosts lead him along a path of darkness where his life has attempted to extinguish the light of Christ. When morning breaks, Scrooge finds himself freed of his sin, and seeking atonement.

The work of RIGHTEOUSNESS is our mission should we choose to accept it. We cannot make ourselves RIGHTEOUS, but we can release our ego and, setting our excuses aside, embrace the promise of God.

It is on-going work—this RIGHTEOUSNESS of God—holy work that never ends. To achieve RIGHTEOUSNESS is not about waiting on a hero, on someone else to come and save the day. It is about our willingness to put our trust in God and God's purposes for us, to examine our wrong doings and embrace our sufferings that we might learn and grow in ways that encourage us to live as Christ in the world.

We cannot be RIGHTEOUS of our own accord, but if we are willing, we can examine who we are and what we have done and discover that our chains are gone and we've been set free.




JOIN US THIS ADVENT
